The Research Journal of the University of Gdańsk Transport Economics and Logistics, which has been in continuous publication since 1971, has now taken up a new challenge. The journal has already achieved recognition throughout Poland; thus, it has been decided that internationalization offers new opportunities. This move brings with it many changes. We have started to prepare a new English version of the journal that will meet international standards. Inter alia, we have implemented an Open Journal System, DOIs, and external data bases. Hitherto, the journal has been listed on Index Copernicus, and all articles are available on the journal web page or through BazEkon. However, our aim is to be listed in international databases, such as WoS, Ebsco, Scopus, and others. In this context, as Editor-in-Chief, I would like to invite authors to submit manuscripts on the range of topics covered by our journal. This invitation is also addressed to reviewers who are willing to cooperate with us in order to enhance the journal's international standing. Finally, readers are welcome to visit our editorial system to download archives as well as to learn about our most recent publications.

Since 1971, The Research Journal of the University of Gdańsk Transport Economics and Logistics has been a worthy successor to the Research Journal of the University of Gdansk Economics of Inland Transportation. As a result of systemic transformation, for several years many articles on logistics and transport economics have been published in the journal that offer the results of research into the substantive changes that have occurred, considering them not from the perspective of a single mode of transport, but looking at more holistic solutions offered by transport economics and logistics. To reflect the changes, the new subtitle Transport Economics and Logistics appeared in the journal in 2012. Currently, the journal publishes original articles on transportation, logistics, and forwarding issues from the point of view of economics, and especially articles on the market, efficiency, functionality, management, infrastructure, modeling, analysis, strategy, concepts, methods, and instruments. These issues are allocated to several research areas, specifically transport economics, the transportation market, forwarding and logistics services, modeling logistics processes and systems, and the development and functioning of transport and logistics systems. These subjects are reflected in the special titles of individual numbers of the journal. The Research Journal of the University of Gdańsk Transport Economics and Logistics is published by the Faculty of Economics, and is edited by representatives of five Departments of Transportation and Logistics. The Department of Logistics invites submissions of original and case manuscripts in the field of logistics. The journal's subject focus derives from the conviction that, currently, logistics has a clear practical dimension in the construction of economic strategies, in shaping the contemporary economic order not just of individual enterprises, but also of entire, increasingly extensive, global chains of supply. In order to ensure complete functionality, including particularly the inter-operative aspect of logistics support systems, processes of planning, designing, building up, and operating, these must draw directly on the sources of theoretical knowledge contained within many scholarly/scientific areas and disciplines. They must also draw on what is currently a rich technical--technological, organizational, and regulatory experience. The conditions that result from the fields of knowledge, practice, and existing regulations create a complex of interrelations; the series Modelling of Logistic Processes and Systems is devoted to an understanding of these. The very manner of

understanding the essence and function of logistics forms the basis for discovering existing interrelations, and for creating new and more rational ones, among theory, practice, and regulation in logistics. That is why the central issue of the interrelations discussed in articles has been the original descriptive model of the system of logistic support for any purposeful activity, for any organization, and for any purposefully implemented productive process. This model is one of the fundamental tools of the work of the Department of Logistics at the University of Gdańsk. This is also why the mission statement of our journal promotes the propagation and development of logistics, taking into consideration the relations that emerge within the triad of theory, practice, and regulation. Knowledge spread in this manner is essential in the process of creating projects for the logistic servicing of every activity, both those related to business and those that are not, in an efficient, effective, and useful manner.

The Department of the Economics and Management of Transportation Companies invites submissions of original and case manuscripts in the field of current problems regarding the efficiency and financial condition of transport companies and the market conditions of their functioning. Articles should present technical and technological specifics, as well as financial and economic factors, which determine their activity. Such specifics include current problems of transport production programming, thus leading to a description of operational process models, of their economic and financial characteristics, and of businesses' relations with the environment and their market behavior. The issues presented should focus primarily on road transport companies, both passenger and freight, together with the relations resulting from changes in the operationalization of the tasks of transport organizers.

The Department of the Transportation Market invites submissions of original and case manuscripts in the field of all aspects of the functioning of the transportation market. Our journal is devoted to the publication of articles that present fresh insights relating to all modes of transport and all types of branch (road, rail, air, water, urban) of passenger and freight transport markets. Topics include fundamental problems of the market: the supply and demand of transport services; quantity and quality of transport services; purchasing behavior and economic relations in the transport market; market research and marketing; modal balance problems and intermodal competition in the transport market; strategies of functioning and development of the market in transport services; changes and directions of development of various transport markets; and innovative market solutions. We are also interested in different aspects of the development of individual markets for transport branches. We are also open to suggestions of subjects related to copyright issues.

#### **Authors' Guide**

#### Types of articles (manuscripts)

- 1. Articles submitted to the Editors must be original, previously unpublished, and not under consideration by any other journal.
- 2. Articles should contain the results of original theoretical or empirical research in the area of the economics of transport and logistics, including case studies, analyses of implementation and application, etc.
- 3. In their choice of type of article, and especially of the research subject and topic of the article, authors should be guided by the criterion of the value that the article adds to theoretical and practical knowledge.

#### Editorial requirements

- 1. A template of an article containing the required formatting is available on the main page of the journal www.znetil.ug.edu.pl. Click on "For Authors."
- 2. The structure of an article should consist of: the title of the article; name(s) of author(s); affiliation(s); abstract; key words; introduction; at least two sections; conclusion; bibliography; e-mail address(es) of the author(s).
- 3. The structure and content of the article should fulfill the demands of subject-related and methodological correctness in the course of reasoned argument. It should also be written in correct standard English.
- 4. Quotations, citations, and bibliography should follow Harvard style.
- 5. Footnotes should not be used with citations. They should only be used for polemical or digressive purposes, which, if they require footnote citation, may be supplemented with a footnote in Harvard style.

### Copyright

- 1.Submission of articles is conditional on the author's or authors' prior agreement with the Editors to disseminate his/her/their article by all possible means.
- 2. This agreement should be provided online within the editorial system, available on the Editorial page www.znetil.ug.edu.pl, during the article submission process.
- 3. In connection with the introduction of the system "ghostwriting & guest authorship," the Editors will document all manifestations of scientific/scholarly impropriety, specifically, for example:
- a) the publication of an article with the same title in different journals, with 50% of the content unchanged;
- b) articles written by a person who is not the author of that article;
- c) the addition of a co-author who made no contribution to the writing of an article, or the omission of a co-author who contributed to writing the article, etc. Authors are also requested to add to the article information concerning the sources of financing of the publication and concerning the contribution of scientific/ scholarly-research institutions, of associations, and of other entities.

#### How to use the Editorial System: A Guide for Authors

- 1. To submit an article, register on the page of the editorial system www.znetil.ug.edu.pl. This system allows authors to download the template of an article (click "For Authors"), to submit an article, to follow the stages of the editorial process, to see reviews, to send a corrected article, and to communicate with the Editors.
- 2. After logging in, in order to send an article to the Editors, choose the option "Submissions," and then click on "New

Submission." Then proceed according to the instructions given on the screen, until the message "Submission Complete" is received.

- 3. If the process of article submission proceeds correctly, an e-mail is automatically sent to the author informing him/her that the article has been submitted.
- 4. Once a review has been received, it will be available for the author after logging on in the Sidebar /Submissions/ My Queue/My Authored/Stage. The author will also receive an e-mail informing him/her of the Editors' decision, along with the reviewers' comments.
- 5. To respond to a review, log on to page of the journal www.znetil.ug.edu.pl, and then choose the Sidebar/Submissions/ My Queue/My Authored/Stage/Review/Review Discussions/ Add discussion, OK.
- 6. To submit a corrected article, log on to the page of the journal www.znetil.ug.edu.pl, and then choose the Sidebar /Submissions/My Queue/My Authored/Stage/Review/Revisions/Upload File, until the message "File added" is received. 7. Immediately upon publication in the journal, the author will be informed of this by e-mail.

## Review procedure

- 1. By submitting an article for publication, authors agree to the review procedure.
- 2. Submitted texts as part of an initial review are evaluated by the Topic Editor from a formal and thematic perspective. If there are no substantial comments, the article is passed on to two competent reviewers, who are specialists in the field that the submitted article relates to, and who have the title of at least doktor habilitowany

- (in the case of reviewers in Poland) and who are members of the Editorial Committee of the journal.
- 3. Submitted articles will not be sent to reviewers who are from the same institution as authors, or to persons who may have a conflict of interest with the author. In the latter case, the author is obliged to inform the Editors of this situation
- 4. In the case of texts written in a language other than Polish, at least one reviewer will be affiliated with a non-Polish institution that is in a country other than that of the author of the text.
- 5. Texts are reviewed confidentially and anonymously (double-blind review). Besides comments related to subject matter, in the review form reviewers will indicate their opinion, which should be taken into consideration by the Editors:
- Accept Submission
- Revisions Required
- Resubmit for Reviewer
- Resubmit Elsewhere
- Decline Submission
- 6. Reviewers must not use their knowledge of the subject of the article prior to its publication.
- 7. A text is given an editorial number, which identifies it during further stages of the editorial procedure.
- 8. Any article presenting the results of empirical research is read by the Editor responsible for statistics.
- g. The author is informed of the result of a review; subsequently, there will be an opportunity for correspondence with the journal Editors relating to any possible comments or to any recommendation concerning publication.
- 10. The final decision regarding publication is made by the Editor-in-Chief.

#### Information for Reviewers

The Research Journal of the University of Gdańsk is a scholarly/ scientific journal publishing articles in the field of the economics of transport and logistics. We invite reviewers to work with the journal Editors in order to ensure a high subject-related standard of articles that are accepted for publication. In the editorial process, we are guided by the criteria of the value of a contribution for theoretical and practical knowledge, of the subject-related and methodological correctness of its reasoning, and of its correctness in its use of language (which we also ask our reviewers to comment on). We also apply the principle of the "double--blind review" in order to ensure the objectivity of a review, both from the perspective of the reviewer and the author. In order to maintain close relations with our reviewers, we will inform them of published numbers and of other important publishing events. Persons interested should contact the editors on the page www.znetil.ug.edu.pl, or register in the editorial system.

## How to use the Editorial System: A Guide for Reviewers

- 1. The reviewer will be contacted by e-mail with a request to review an article, along with a link to the editorial page. The reviewer has access to the editorial panel for reviewers after registering/logging on.
- 2. To register, go onto the page of the editorial system www.znetil.ug.edu.pl, click on "Register" and then give the required information and choose the option "Yes, request the Reviewer role."
- 3. After logging in, it is possible to accept or reject an article, download the review form, download the file with the article, and send the file with the review.

We encourage you to sign up for the publishing notification service for this journal at the web page www.znetil.ug.edu.pl. Use the Register link at the top of the home page for the journal. This registration will result in the reader's receiving by e-mail the Table of Contents for each new issue of the journal, with the possibility to download articles. Please see the Privacy Statement of the journal, which assures readers that their name and email address will not be used for other purposes.
